Y.M.C.A. – Village People – Notes



- Activity types: Phonetics, listening for specific words, gap fill, dancing.
- **Level:** Pre-intermediate/Intermediate
- **Notes:** In 1977 producers Jacques Morali and Henri Belolo assembled a group parodying gay stereotypes. The song Y.M.C.A. (the acronym for Young Men's Christian Association) quickly became a popular party song, with a dance where people form the letters with their arms. You can see Village People performing this on www.tuneintoenglish.com. In 2008 the dance was performed by 40,148 fans in El Paso, entering the Guinness Book of Records as the largest YMCA dance ever there is also a video of this online. This worksheet was published to commemorate ten years of the Tune Into English Roadshow the song closed the shows in the years from 2005 to 2013.

Pre-listening activities

Give each student a folded copy of the worksheet and ask them to do **Activity 1**. They list the words according to their final vowel sounds.


